

Are You Ready for Storm Genson?

Storms and natural disasters are all part of living in Central Texas, so homeowners must be prepared. Do you know what to do in an emergency? Below are some important ways that Texas homeowners can be prepared as we head into storm season:

- Make a Plan: In case of emergency evacuation, does your family know where to go? Every member of a family should know where to meet in case of an evacuation, as well as have a plan for shelter-in-place emergencies. Practice what to do with your family so everyone is well prepared!
- Stay in the Know: There are lots of ways to ensure your family gets necessary information in case of emergency. Sign up for emergency weather alerts online, through Williamson County Emergency Services, and through your local utility providers. Hint: Sign up for emergency water alerts at JonahWater.com by clicking the red button on the home page!
- **Stock Up on Supplies:** A shelter-in-place order may seem like he easier option when compared to evacuating in an emergency, but most household aren't prepared. Make sure to have extra batteries, flashlights, first aid supplies, medications, non-perishable food items, drinkable water, cell phone chargers and sanitary items on hand in a safe place. What other items might your family need? Check out the recommended supply list from FEMA at www.ready.gov
- Protect Your Belongings: Make sure important documents, passports, birth certificates, etc. are stored in a fire and water proof container away from the ground, but accessible in case of evacuation. Also ensure your homeowner's insurance is up-to-date and that you're familiar with the terms and deductibles and important phone numbers.
- Protect Your Pets: While many people consider pets to be regular members of the family, they have very different needs during an emergency. Pack them an emergency supply kit that includes vaccination records, any medications, food, a water bowl, photos of your pet, and any leashes or carriers you may need to transport them in case of evacuation.

Understanding Your Water Bill

"I stopped watering my lawn almost 3 weeks ago, why is my bill so high?" Below, we take a look at why water bills don't feel like they match up with usage during certain parts of the year:



Although collecting water usage data is primarily done electronically, we still have to manually collect the wireless transmissions each month, generate bills, give ample time for them to be received by mail customers, and time to pay them. So, the bill you pay each month is for water usage almost 2 months ago! Customers may be surprised this time of year when they expect bills to go down, and they will... when we bill for those dates! (Hint: This bill is for water used from Aug 10 - Sep 9 but isn't due until Oct 15th!)
